

Dr. Jeffrey Petersen / Interim Department Chair & Sport **Management Program Director**

Dr. Petersen was promoted to the rank of full professor in the Spring of 2018. Petersen has prior Sport Management teaching and leadership experience in several collegiate settings, as well as a teacher coach, athletic director and district chair at the interscholastic level. He has published work in more than 70 peer-reviewed journal manuscripts and has made 170 refereed presentations at state, national, and international conferences. He released his first textbook, Facility and Event Management: Applications in Sport, in 2017 with his co-authors, Dr. Lawrence Judge and Dr. John Miller.



Dr. Marshall Magnusen / Associate Professor

Dr. Magnusen currently serves as the President of the Applied Sport Management Association. He is the Editor of the Journal of Applied Sport Management, and he serves as an editorial board member for the *Journal of Amateur Sport* and the Journal of Global Sport Management. He has published over 40 peerreviewed articles and several book chapters and has made over 40 presentations at national and international conferences. He is the author of numerous articles published in such journals as the Journal of Management, International Journal of Sport Psychology, and Career Development International.



Alumni Spotlight: Diana Cantu

Originally from Mexico, after receiving her Bachelor's degree from the University of Tennessee, Cantu finished her Masters in Sport Management at Baylor in 2015. After playing for the women's golf team at Tennessee, she became the assistant Coach for the Lady Bears Golf team from Fall of 2011 to the Spring of 2014. After finishing as an intern for Baylor University Compliance and the assistant coach for Baylor's Women's Golf team, Diana was hired as the Head Women's Golf Coach for the University of Maryland. She is currently going on her sixth year as Head Coach. Her position as the Assistant Coach for Baylor's Women's Golf Team allowed her to hone her skills that aided in her getting her current job. She cites that she was able "to coach student-athletes and immerse herself in the day to day activities of what it is to coach and mentor collegiate golfers to be not only better athletes, but most importantly better people." Along with her assistant coach position she was also able to gain better at understanding the rules and regulations that govern collegiate





sports in her GA role in the compliance office. Diana added that classes like facilities and sport marketing had been "incredibly helpful as she goes through new facility planning for her program as well as student-athlete recruitment." Furthermore, the information that was covered by the professors in the SPM program, as well as their experience and knowledge, guided Diana to make her professional aspirations come to life. Diana's advice to students in the SPM is to "use the resources given by their professors." She credited Dr. Petersen for making the material relatable and up to date with what is happening in the sports industry. Diana hopes to continue to mentor young female athletes throughout their college careers and make them not only the best golfers they can be, but the best citizens and role models. She said the SPM program helped strengthen her views on holistic coaching and mentoring and wishes to continue with that mentality, succeeding on and off the golf course. Chee defends thesis and moves on to Doctoral studies

Finishing your thesis as a master's student can be rewarding as well as hectic time. For Chee Qi, it was nothing short of either. His process starting in August of 2019. He generated a research question and began the creation of a literature review. From there, he organized his methodology, collected and analyzed data, and then discussed his results. Despite the presence of Cov-19, Chee was able to collect data from over 300 participants via an online survey tool and the support of Dr. Maddox from the statistics department. This collection was "the major hurdle [he] had to overcome and is what made the rest of [his] thesis meaningful." 2020 and was followed by an oral examination. The Master's thesis experience was and is still a "meaningful and irreplaceable part in [his] journey." Going through this process prepared him on how to conduct formal research and gave him a taste of what he could expect as he continues toward his Doctorate. He wanted to acknowledge his mentor, Dr. Magnusen, for showing him patience and sharing his expertise and wisdom. Along with Dr. Magnusen, Chee is thankful for the guidance that Dr. Petersen provided him. Chee is currently a PhD student in Sport and Entertainment Management at the University of South Carolina. At USC, he is being mentored by Dr. Samuel Todd.
